

Prayer for the Election from the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops—

Archbishop Jackels sent the priests the following prayer which we can pray at election time. I commend this prayer to you.

Lord God, as the election approaches, we seek to better understand the issues and concerns that confront our country, and how the Gospel compels us to respond as faithful citizens in our community.

We ask for eyes that are free from blindness so that we might see each other as brothers and sisters, one and equal in dignity, especially those who are victims of abuse and violence, deceit and poverty.

We ask for ears that will hear the cries of children unborn and those abandoned, men and women oppressed because of race or creed, religion or gender.

We ask for minds and hearts that are open to hearing the voice of leaders who will bring us closer to your Kingdom.

We pray for discernment so that we may choose leaders who hear your Word, live your love, and keep in the ways of your truth as they follow in the steps of Jesus and his Apostles and guide us to your Kingdom of justice and peace.

We ask this in the name of your Son Jesus Christ and through the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Why Do We Pray for the Dead?—A few weeks ago I commemorated Fr. Alovsius Schmitt in my pastor's pen. He was the first chaplain to be killed in World War II on Pearl Harbor Day and was a priest of the Archdiocese of Dubuque. Last month, a Memorial Mass for Father was celebrated at Loras College after which his mortal remains were buried. The liturgy was a prayerful celebration of hope in the death and resurrection of Jesus. We professed what Christ taught: Those who die with Him will rise with Him. We prayed for Fr. Schmitt in the hope that he would enjoy eternal life. His family commemorated their relatedness to him by blood, memories and faith. The archdiocesan family remembered their relationship with him as a priest and brother in Christ. We, the living, were connected in relationship with Father Schmitt in death through the love of Christ. We prayed for Father because he, like the rest of us, was wounded by Original Sin. We asked that if there was any sin that remained upon his death, he might be purified and prepared for his face-to-face meeting with God and freed from Purgatory through our intercession.

That celebration and prayer was a microcosm of what Catholics and all Christians are called to do for the dead. Pray for the dead as an act of love, of charity, because you are joined with them in Christ and they with you. Praying for the dead is a spiritual work of mercy, asking that they be cleansed of all sin and prepared to enjoy eternity with God.

Lastly, after his Memorial Mass and the military rites which were a loving commemoration of Father's life in thanksgiving for his service to our country and the ultimate sacrifice of his life, his mortal remains were reverently buried in a blessed tomb. This was an expression of faith that one day, body and soul would be reunited in the resurrection of the dead when Christ comes again in all of his glory. It was a proper, respectful disposition of his mortal remains, all in anticipation of when Christ will come again.

This is our faith: A belief in Christ's death, resurrection and ascension, our participation in it through baptism, a reverent commemoration of the deceased and commending them to the Lord's care, praying that they be freed from sin and united eternally with God. The deceased's body or ashes are to be respected and reverently interred in a blessed place, typically in a cemetery, in anticipation of the resurrection of the body on the last day.

As part of the commemoration of the dead at St. Joseph, we have placed the pictures of those whose funerals were celebrated by the parish over the past year in the prayer corner near the choir area and inscribed their names in the parish Book of the Dead, which is located near the pictures. You are welcome to write in the book the names of the deceased for which you would like our parish community to pray throughout November.


