

St. Teresa of Calcutta—On September 4th, Pope Francis declared Mother Teresa of Calcutta a saint. Those who experienced her before she died recognized her sanctity in the love she had for Jesus and humanity. While serving Jesus in the poorest of the poor,

sharing the maternity of God through her acts of merciful charity, some criticized her because she was a religious sister who wore a habit, wasn't a politically correct contemporary advocate for women in the Church, her homes for the dying weren't up to Western standards, and was conservative in her religious practice because, for example, she spent time before the Blessed Sacrament. No saint is devoid of criticism, no matter how narrow it might be.

We rejoice instead with the preaching of Pope Francis during the Mass of St. Teresa's canonization, some of which I share with you here. "Mother Teresa, in all aspects of her life, was a generous dispenser of divine mercy, making herself available for everyone through her welcome and defense of human life, those unborn and those abandoned and discarded. She was committed to defending life, ceaselessly proclaiming that 'the unborn are the weakest, the smallest, the most vulnerable'. She bowed down before those who were spent, left to die on the side of the road, seeing in them their God-given dignity; she made her voice heard before the powers of this world, so that they might recognize their guilt for the crime – the crimes! – of poverty they created. For Mother Teresa, mercy was the "salt" which gave flavour to her work, it was the "liaht" which shone in the darkness of the many who no longer had tears to shed for their poverty and suffering.

Her mission to the urban and existential peripheries remains for us today an eloquent witness to God's closeness to the poorest of the poor. Today, I pass on this emblematic figure of womanhood and of consecrated life to the whole world of volunteers: may she be your model of holiness! I think, perhaps, we may have some difficult[y] in calling her 'Saint Teresa': her holiness is so near to us, so tender and so fruitful that we continu[e] to spontaneously call her 'Mother Teresa'. May this tireless worker of mercy help us increasingly to understand that our only criterion for action is gratuitous love, free from every ideology and all obligations, offered freely to everyone without distinction of language, culture, race or religion. Mother Teresa loved to say, 'Perhaps I don't speak their language, but I can smile'. Let us carry her smile in our hearts and give it to those whom we meet along our journey, especially those who suffer. In this way, we will open up opportunities of joy and hope for our many brothers and sisters who are discouraged and who stand in need of understanding and tenderness.'

In the end, it is the holiness of the saint that overwhelmingly prevails rather than the narrow voice of people lost in their own issues. What a blessing it is to know a canonized saint, as some of you may have met her, but surely been inspired by her as you experienced her through television, film and other media. May St. Teresa of Calcutta be a model of holiness and we strive to imitate her example.

Canonization of a Saint—During Sunday Mass when Blessed Teresa of Calcutta was canonized a saint, Pope Francis used this declaration from the Church's official prayer to state to the Church and the world that Mother Teresa is a saint.

Formula of Canonization

For the honour of the Blessed Trinity, the exaltation of the Catholic faith and the increase of the Christian life, by the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ, and of the Holy Apostles Peter and Paul, and our own, after due deliberation and frequent prayer for divine assistance, and having sought the counsel of many of our brother Bishops, we declare and define

Blessed Teresa of Calcutta

to be a Saint and we enroll her among the Saints, decreeing that she is to be venerated as such by the whole Church. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen!

About Responsible Citizenship from Archbishop Jackels--Archbishop Jackels recently communicated that "For every right there is a corresponding duty. And so we also have a duty to vote. The Catholic Church even speaks of a moral obligation to vote. We also have a duty to inform ourselves about issues so as to vote conscientiously. Everyone guides his or her choices by something. For Catholics, that something should be the teachings of Christ and his church."

To assist individuals to exercise their right to vote, the Archdiocese has gathered resources on faithful citizenship from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, the Catholic Bishops of Iowa and the Iowa Catholic Conference. Exaltation of the Cross at St. Joseph


