

Flooding in Northeast Iowa—The Archbishop sent to the priests of the Archdiocese an email he received from Fr. Bob Gross who is pastor of some of the parishes affected by the recent flooding in Northeast Iowa. I offer you

this quote from Fr. Gross' email, ". . . It has been quite the week for us with the horrible flooding we experienced this last week. I am pastor of four parishes in Northeast *Iowa and two of them, St. Wencesclaus in Spillville and* St. Aloysius in Calmar both experienced damage from the flooding. Spillville was hit the hardest. There are some families in the community who may not be able to return to their homes because of the flooding. Presently we are going to be housing a displaced family from our parishes in the old convent Neumann Hall in Calmar. Along with Spillville and Calmar, Decorah had terrible flooding as well." Father went on to offer three ways people could help with the flood recovery: (1) Through cash donations that would support their efforts in temporary housing for flood victims; (2) Help with the physical clean-up, and; (3) Through our prayers." What Father offered were acts of mercy to do for those affected by the flood. With the epic flood of 2008 that afflicted us in recent memory, it isn't hard to know the pain of those whose lives have been affected by recent flooding.

To help our neighbors in northeast Iowa, we will take up a special second collection the weekend of Sept. 10-11, 2016, to assist the support of flood victims Fr. Gross' parishes are offering. Please continue to remember them in your prayers. If you would like to help with flood clean -up, contact Fr. Gross (*DBQ019@dbqarch.org*). This would be a good work of mercy for individuals, families or parish groups and committees.
